



Collective Authority and One Voice

"Individual trustees, regardless of their position on the board, do not have the power to command the services of a library staff member, nor to speak or act on behalf of the library unless they have been specifically granted that authority by a vote of the board."

Duty of Care

"A trustee must act in good faith and exercise the degree of diligence, care and skill that an ordinary prudent individual would use under similar circumstances in a like position."

- Be present, prepared and curious!
- Fiduciary responsibility
- Exercise personal judgment

Duty of Loyalty

"Trustees owe allegiance to the institution and must act in good faith with the best interest of the institution in mind. The conduct of a trustee must, at all times, further the institution's goals and not the member's personal or business interests...... A trustee should avoid even the appearance of impropriety..."

- Up-to-date Conflict of Interest policy
- Avoid even the appearance of a conflict of interest
- Put the Library first!



Duty of Obedience

"A trustee has a responsibility to insure that the institution's resources are dedicated to the fulfillment of its mission. The trustee also has a duty to ensure that the institution complies with all applicable laws and does not engage in any unauthorized activities"

- Know & understand the library's mission
- Be aware of important law and regulations
- Be certain that your Library's resources are solely dedicated to Library purposes

Role of a Trustee



The library board is a very powerful entity – in it rests the final responsibility to see that the library provides the best possible service to its community.

The Nine Essential Trustee Responsibilities

- 1) Create and develop the mission of the library
- 2) Select, hire and regularly evaluate a qualified library director

Library board GOVERNS; Library director MANAGES

The Nine Essential Trustee Responsibilities

- 3) Secure adequate funding for the library's service program;
- 4) Exercise fiduciary responsibility for the use of public and private funds;
- 5) Adopt policies and rules regarding library governance and use;
- 6) Regularly plan and evaluate the library's service program;

The Nine Essential Trustee Responsibilities

- 7) Maintain a facility that meets the library's and community's needs;
- 8) Promote the library in the local community and in society in general;
- 9) Conduct the business of the library in an open and ethical manner in compliance with all applicable laws and regulations and with respect for the institution, staff and public.
