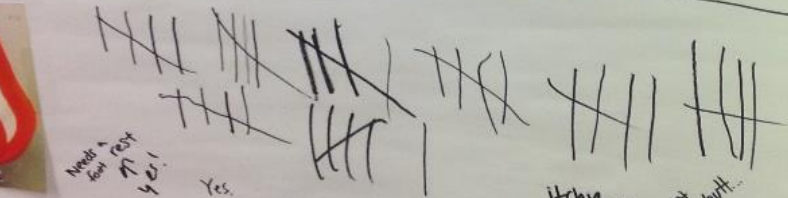
- 2005-2007 (Renovation complete in 2007)

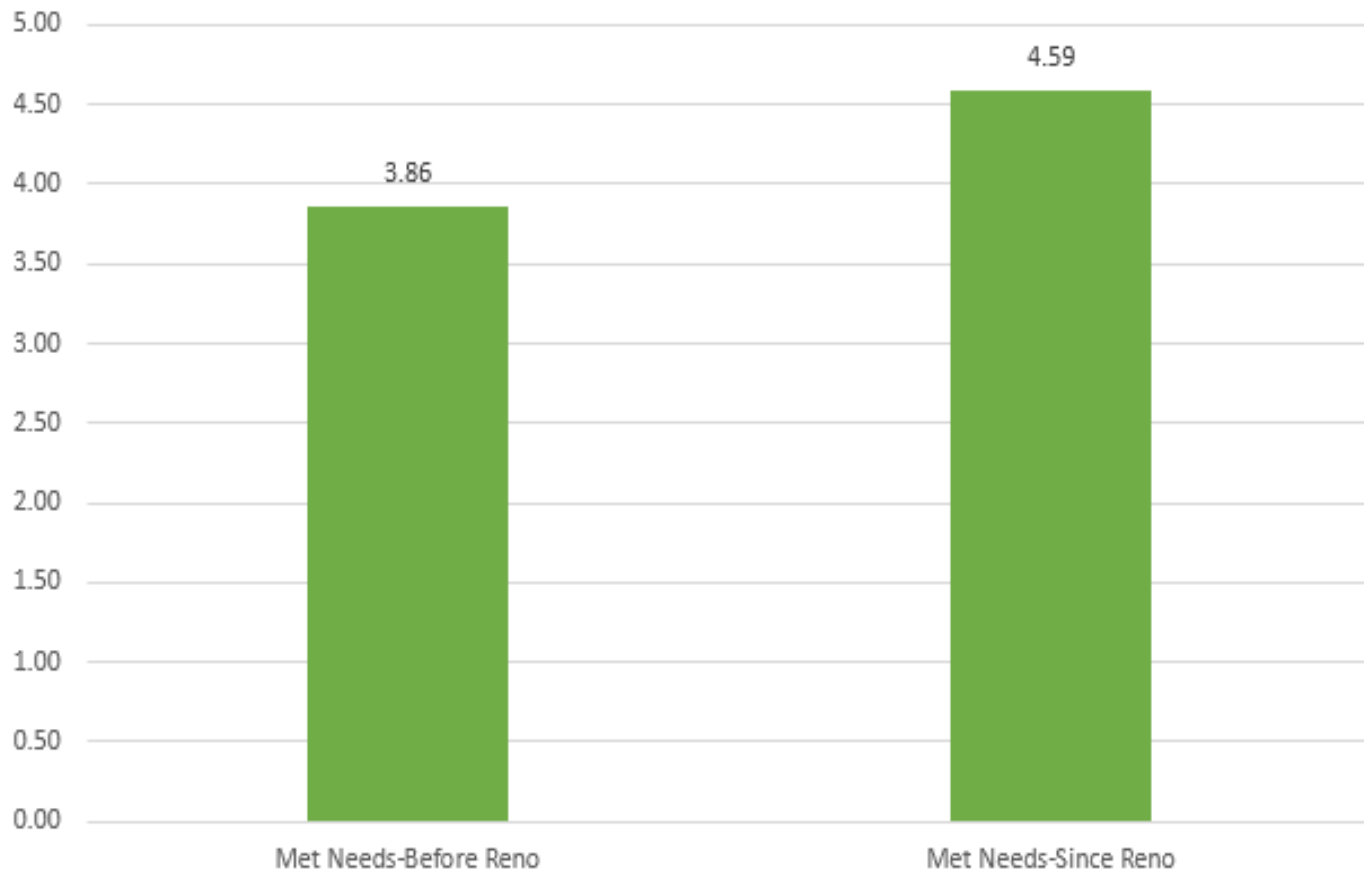




# Satisfaction after renovation
